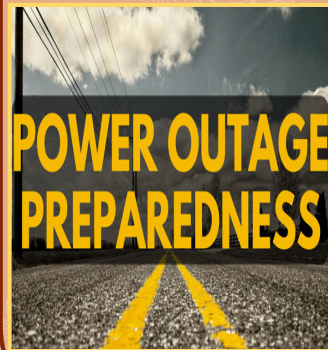

**Answer:** Yes, the bathroom night lights are powered by the generator

- ❖ Red outlet in room will continue to have power

during an outage. This is used for medical equipment such as O2 concentrators, CPAP Machines, and other medical devices

- ❖ Dogwood Village Senior Living is prepared for a power outage; whether short-lived or extended; with a plan to shelter in place rather than to evacuate residents and staff to another location.
- ❖ In Virginia, the Department of Social Services regulations require a 96-hour supply of food and drinking water to be on hand. Dogwood Village has this always stored.

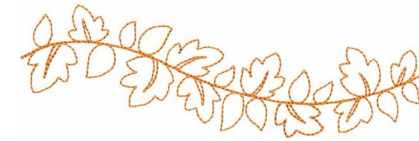
