- DO NOT Talk to telemarketers
 - Use an answering machine
 - Use your caller I.D. or get caller I.D.
 - Hang up the phone if there is a long hesitation or if it is not someone you recognize.
- If you talk to them, trust your Instincts.
 - Never give your out your personal information
 - credit card numbers
 - bank, ID number
 - drivers license numbers
 - social security number
 - Ask what state or federal agencies the company is registered with or regulated by
 - Get it in writing. If the offer sounds "too good to be true," it probably is. Don't be pressured.
 - Ask to be put on the Do-Not-Call List.
 - Keep a call log. Write down dates and times you've received called when you'd requested not to be called

Please remember if you place something on your front door it needs to be metal or fire rated to follow our guidelines from the fire marshal.

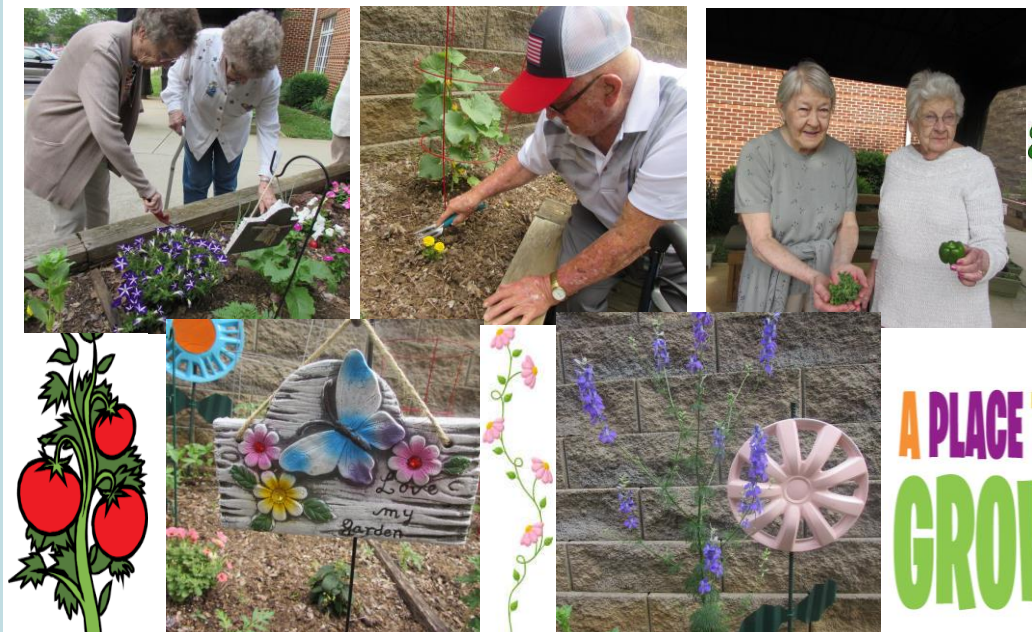
Environmental Services-

What is Hyperthermia?

Hyperthermia is a group of illnesses that may result from being too hot for too long.

Who may be at risk?

- People with heart or blood vessel problems
Diagnoses of lung, or kidney disease
Diagnoses of high blood pressure
People taking beta blockers or diuretics.

How to prevent hyperthermia-

- Drink plenty of fluids- Water, fruit juices
Avoid caffeine and alcohol
Use fans or Air Conditioning
Stay in the cool during the hottest parts of the day
Do no go out or exercise in the heat
Shower, bathe or sponge off with cool water if needed
