**Safety First- Elevator Safety**

**When boarding elevators:**

- Allow passengers exiting the elevator to clear before boarding
- Watch your step - the elevator may not be perfectly level with the floor
- Stand clear of the doors - keep clothes, walkers and accessories away from the opening
- Passengers nearest to the doors should move first when the elevator arrives
- Push and hold the DOOR

- OPEN button if doors need to be held open, or ask someone to push the button for you
- Never try to stop a closing door, wait for the next elevator
- Once on board, quickly press the button for your floor and move to the back of the car to make room for other passengers
- If there is an emergency press the Help button and the receptionist will answer. Explain the problem and she will send assistance.
