Volunteer Spotlight- June Clements

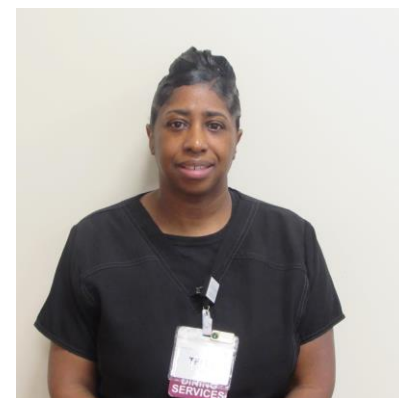
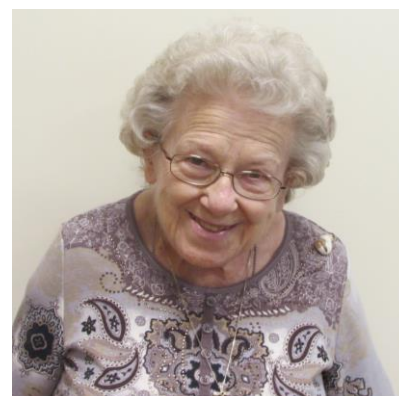
