COVID-19 INFORMATION

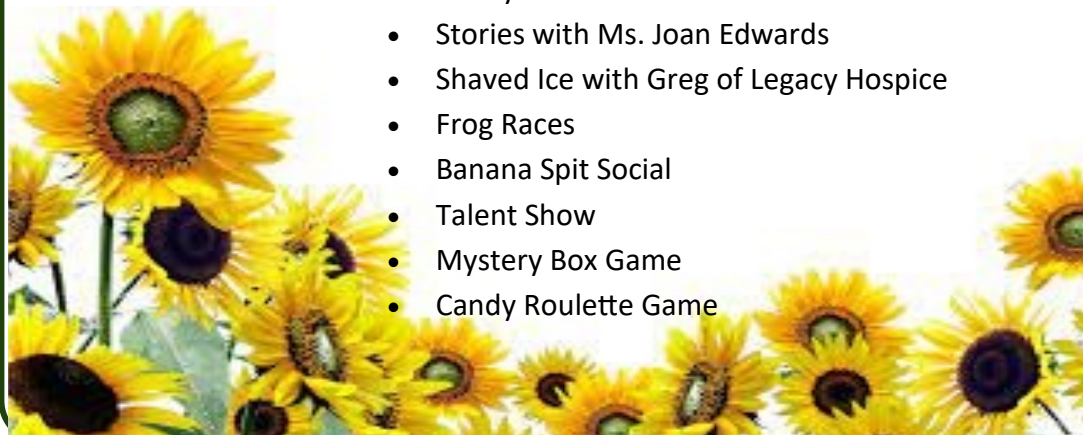

Dealing With Weather - Related Emergencies

Watch vs Warning: What's the Difference?

Watch - When conditions are favorable for the development of severe weather including tornado, high winds or approaching hurricane, a watch is initiated. Staff will monitor weather alerts on TV, radio, and NOAA weather radio and prepare to take action when necessary.

Warning - When a watch is changed to a warning by the National Weather Service, staff must take immediate action.

Lightening and Thunderstorms -

- ◆ Remain calm. Be aware of your surroundings. Check weather forecasts before participating in outdoor activities.
- ◆ ***"When thunder roars, go indoors"***. Go indoors where it is safe. Workers will assist to safety.
- ◆ Avoid contact with water.
- ◆ Stay away from windows.
- ◆ Avoid electronic equipment. Do **NOT** use your computers, laptops, or anything connected to an electrical outlet. Lightning can travel through electrical systems, radio and television reception systems.
