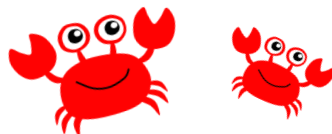

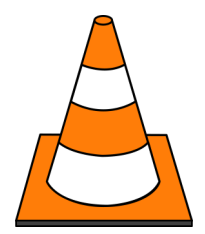
Safety Topics



Tornado and Hurricane Safety

3. The 4th of July wasn't officially named a holiday for nearly a century. Federal recognition happened in 1870, the provision wasn't expanded to include July 4th as a *paid* holiday for federal employees until 1941.
4. The first 4th of July parade took place in Rhode Island.
5. Although Francis Scott Key penned the tune in 1814, The Star-Spangled Banner didn't become America's National Anthem until President Hoover signed a congressional act on March 3, 1931.
6. Three presidents- John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, and James Monroe all passed away on July 4th.
